### From the President's Desk

The Jawaharlal Nehru Hockey Tournament Society successfully celebrated its Golden Jubilee year during 2013. It truly was a festive Season as far as hockey players and the game's followers were concerned. Thousands of spectators who thronged the Shivaji Stadium were treated to vintage hockey dished out by the teams participating in the tournaments. Doubling of prize money and a Luxury Car presented to Best Player of the Tournament by TOREX created a history in the domestic Hockey Tournaments for the Senior Men's tournament was one of the several salient features that were provided by us this year.



The golden jubilee celebrations began with the HI-20<sup>th</sup> Nehru Girls tournament which had 20 teams from across the country taking part Kiddy's Corner HSS (Gwalior) avenged their previous year's loss against Govt Girls Sr Sec School (Shahabad) in the final. The 31<sup>st</sup> edition of HI-Nehru Sub-Junior Boys (under-15) saw a record number of entries (34 teams) and was won by Town High School from Sundergarh (Odisha) who beat CRZ Sr Sec School, Sonepat. Govt Model Sr School (Chandigarh) claimed the STEELBIRD INTERNATIONAL 42<sup>nd</sup> Nehru Junior title beating five-time winners and defending champions Birsa Munda Vidyapitha 2-1 in the final. The icing on the 'golden jubilee' cake of Nehru Society was the TOREX-50<sup>th</sup> Nehru Senior Hockey Tournament, the most prestigious and much-awaited competition in hockey in the country Punjab and Sind Bank wrote Its name on the golden trophy for the fourth year by beating Bharat Petroleum 6-5 in a pulsating final.

To mark the golden jubilee, the Nehru Hockey Society honoured some of the outstanding players of the past, veteran administrators and eminent sports journalists by presenting them Life Time Achievement Awards. They included Padmashri Balbir Singh (Sr), Padmashri Pargat Singh, Shri I.M. Kapur, Shri Subhash Kapur, Shri Krishan Datta and Shri Roshan lal Sethi. A hockey clinic, organised by Hero, in collaboration with Commune and FIH, was conducted at Shivaji Stadium where over 50 young players had the benefit of learning the game from reputed coaches Similarly, to mark our golden jubilee, an exhibition match between the Alumni of Doon School (Dehradun) and Mayo College (Ajmer) was held.

All our regular tournaments and various other events held as part o' our Society's golden jubilee celebrations would not have been a success without the generous support received from the sponsors throughout. I deeply appreciate the willingness with which they continue to sponsor our efforts. I sincerely hope that this association will be maintained and that they will continue to support us In our future endeavours.

## HI-20TH NEHRU GIRLS TOURNAMENT (OCTOBER 8-18, 2013) A Big 'Shabash' to Shahabad Girls

Come October-November, it is festive season in Delhi We are not referring just to Dussehra and Diwali but to the two-month-long festival of tournaments' that the Jawaharlal Nehru Hockey Tournament Society (JNHTS) has been conducting so successfully and meticulously year after year.



The first in the series of five annual tournaments this year began with the 20<sup>th</sup> edition of Nehru Girls tournament at Shivaji Stadium, during October 8-18. This year the tournament had Hockey India as title sponsors. New Delhi Municipal Council (NDMC), provided grant-in-aid for the event.

The tournament which had 20 teams from across the country took part, was inaugurated by NDMC Chairman Shri Jalaj Srivastava, IAS in the presence of large galaxy of eminent hockey-loving personalities.

For the third year in succession, the tournament saw the same two teams, viz. Govt Girls Sr Sec School (Shahabad) and Kiddy's Corner HSS (Gwalior) fought for final honours. If 2011

saw the girls from Shahabad win the title, it was the turn of the Gwalior girls to avenge the defeat last year. And the Shahabad school regained the title this time with a 4-2 verdict in their summit clash.

In the semi-finals, Birsa Munda Vidyapitha (Rourkela) failed to live up to its reputation (three-time winners and three-time runners-up) and crashed 4-0 to Kiddy's Corner. In the other semi-final, Shahabad girls scored an identical 4-0 win over Govt Girls Model Sr Sec School (Chandigarh).

In the play-off for the third place, Birsa Munda Vidyapitha (Rourkela) beat Government Model SSS (Chandigarh) 5-3. The two semi-finals and the final were played under flood-lights.

The winners received Rs 96,000 while team coach Shri Baldev Singh. Dronacharya awardee, was rewarded Rs 8.000. Runners-up team were richer by Rs 64,000 and its coach Ms Usha B Nair by Rs

The second competition in the series of five annual tournaments organised by the Jawaharlal Nehru Hockey Tournament Society, HI-31<sup>st</sup> Nehru Sub-Junior Boys (Under-15) hockey tournament, was held at the Shivaji Stadium in Delhi from October 18 to 30. 2013. Title-sponsored by Hockey India, the tournament was inaugurated by Shri Mandeep Singh Chhatwal, Director, TORQUE Pharmaceuticals Pvt Ltd. in the presence of a large number of distinguished guests and invitees.

This year, the tournament witnessed a record number of entries (34 teams), the previous maximum entries being 32 in 1986 and 1991. Thirty of the 36 teams played in the preliminary league.

The final was presided over by Shri Rishi Srivastava, Mg. Director, Rockland Group of Hospitals (Delhi). The winners took a purse of Rs 96.000 while team Coach M. (October 30 - November 14, 2013) Chandigarh model boys regain title



The 42<sup>nd</sup> edition of Nehru Junior Hockey tournament for boys under-17 years was held at the Shivaji Stadium in Delhi during October 30-November 14.2013. This was the third in the series of five annual competitions being held by the Jawaharlal Nehru Hockey Tournament Society, which is celebrated its golden jubilee this year.

The tournament was title-sponsored by auto industry giants STEELBIRD INTERNATIONAL. The 50<sup>th</sup> golden jubilee edition of the country's most prestigious and much-awaited Jawaharlal Nehru Hockey Tournament, conducted most efficiently and successfully by the Nehru Hockey Tournament Society in the loving memory of the country's first Prime Minister Pt Jawaharlal Nehru, concluded at Shivaji Stadium in New Delhi on November 25.


